We reach out to disadvantaged children, young people and adults from the local communities, in order to positively impact their lives, through various programmes. Our goal is to create a welcoming and inclusive environment where everyone feels comfortable and valued. By bringing people together from different walks of life we learn from each other acreate a more vibrant and connected community. We particularly seek to reach the parent/cares of the BAME SEND community although we have

children from all cultures join our clubs.

Our programmes include **Destiny Children** SEN Club which is the creative social club for children with special educational needs and disabilities. **Destiny Children** SEN Club also offers a regular support forum for parents/carers both in person and online via our WhatsApp group.

LWFCI Sports Clubs during the past year has consisted of a weekly, Saturday Football club and a midweek Basketball session for the under 16s Short Breaks and HAF (Holidays, Activities,

Food) activities have become a regular holiday feature of our organisation during school holidays for the past 4 years, in partnership with Bromley Children and Families Voluntary Sector

Forum and London Borough of Bromley. ShortBreaks specialist provisions offer 'respite' short breaks enabling children and young people with disabilities to have enjoyable experiences away from their primary carers, contributing to their social inclusion and personal and social development. They also provide the parents and carers of children and young people with disabilities with a necessary and valuable break from their caring responsibilities, knowing their child will be cared for and will have enormous fun.

# Highlights of our work

Football is for pan-ability boys and girls aged 8-15 years, running every Saturday from 2pm to 3.30pm at Harris Academy in Tintagel Road, Orpington, on the Ramsden Estate. This class is free to all Clarion residents, or £1 per session for all other residents. Our football club has a weekly turnout of approximately 22 boys and girls.

We have been running Short Breaks and HAF (Holidays, Activities, Food), during school holidays, in partnership with Bromley Children and Families Voluntary Sector Forum and London Borough of Bromley for the past 4 years. The popularity of these free, full day sessions for parents of children with severe SEND has meant that we always have a waiting list. Thanks to funding we are able to offer a

Inclusive **Basketball** for young people up to age 16 runs on Tuesday evenings, in Bromley, from 5.30pm - 6.30pm.

Our goal is still to expand the programme to include 17-24 year olds but funding is proving difficult to secure.

#### Destiny Children SEN club

- Our **Wednesday club** is still an online **Zoom** session where the children enjoy sensory activities, singing and social activities, interacting, discussing their week and receiving support and guided play. We have continued to provide our weekly sessions of creative, social activities for children with Special Educational Needs for two hours on a Monday giving carers a short break. Our parent/carer support group has resumed and thanks to funding from the Mayor of London we run two sessions per month. Our daytime session runs every first Wednesday at United Reform Church in Bromley from 11am-1pm and our evening session runs at The Pavilion Hotel in Orpington every third Monday from 5pm – 7pm. The parent can drop their child at club and walk to the venue where they can relax with other parents whilst enjoying a hot meal. We have many guest speakers lined up for 2024 and these events have proved popular with parents as we offer support when we meet, share information and personal experiences, and meet new people who are in similar circumstances to ourselves. We want our projects to support families with children with a range of disabilities such as Autism, ADHD, speech and language difficulties as well as other learning disabilities.
- We have seen positive outcomes through our clubs. All our projects encourage social communication and bonds between children, their parents, and peers, and help children and young people to develop self-esteem, improving social integration in the process. Destiny Children and Family Support Group is currently funded by BBC Children in Need and Clarion Futures. We appreciate their funding for these beneficial projects.

#### • Our Project Work in 2023

#### **Update of Destiny Children Project**

#### Monday Session at Mountfield Community Centre Orpington

Destiny Children and Family Support project is managed by LWFCI-UK and is led by a team of staff and volunteers, the majority of whom are themselves parents or carers of children with special needs and learning disabilities or SEN teachers/teaching assistants from local schools. Our Monday sessions are held at Mountfield Community Centre in the St Mary Cray part of Orpington

Tutorial support in Maths, English, reading and writing continues ad hoc but only at the request of parent. We do lots of creative social activities to boost communication, learning development and friendships.

### Wednesday Zoom Club with Miss Sade

On Wednesday evening we have our regular Zoom club for the children. When this started, during Lockdown, it used to be 2 hours long. Then we ran out of funding and can now only afford one hour from 6-7pm with only 1 leader.

With the hour we make time for socialising and a game of bingo. With two hours we used to do art and crafts, with volunteers dropping resources at the childrens' homes, in order that they had the same resources as the leader. The children could then follow along, making some great memories and creations they can keep forever. They also played Hangman and the online game Blooket, where the children have to answer questions in a quiz and then steal gold from each other. They loved it. Sometimes we might have time for one quick game of Blooket after bingo but they are always asking for more and we would love to have the extra time with them

We have been doing bingo for 3 years now and the children have won many prizes and are excited to choose their prize on Amazon then it arrives at their front door! Many of our children have struggled with not winning but over time they have started to learn that sometimes you will lose, not cry, congratulate the winner and now, even ask each other what they are going to choose for their prizes! Most of the children on Zoom can't access any of our clubs activities so this is the only social interaction, with other peers, that they have access to, other than school, so they really look forward to this all week. If we could get more funding we can go back to doing art, craft and sensory games and give them a two hour Virtual Youth Club.

#### Christmas 2023


